A TIME TO PREPARE

There is so much happening all around us, but as we pray for our nation and look up to God to move again in our land, there's a strong impression to prepare ourselves and our hearts for what God is about to do. But, how do we prepare and what do we do at this crucial time?

There are four key things that I believe we ought to be doing at this time, as we continue to pray and stand in the gap for this nation.

1. Keep Our Eyes on Jesus – *Hebrews 12:1-4; Matthew 11:28-30; Psalm 46:10*

3. Live and Walk in the Spirit – John 14:16-18, 26; John 16:5-15; Acts 1:8

4. WAIT!!! – Psalm 130:5-6; Lamentations 3:25-26; Acts 1:4

To wait does not mean to be passive and inactive, which leads to frustration, fear and despair. To wait on God is to be patient and expectant for God's timing, knowing that your

expectation will not be cut off. God shall surely answer, He will not fail you. Learning to wait on God is an indication that we trust Him.

Waiting keeps us tuned in to God and helps us enterinto His rest. Our hope and expectation in waiting, therefore, should not be on when and how God will answer our prayers, but that God WILL answer our prayers. When we wait in this manner, we will not miss it when He does answer our prayers.

Finally...

"In view of all this, make every effort to respond to God's promises. Supplement your faith with a generous provision of moral excellence, and moral excellence with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with patient endurance, and patient endurance with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love for everyone. The more you grow like this, the more productive and useful you will be in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." (2 Peter 1:5-8)

We need perseverance to do the above four things. We need to persevere in focusing on Jesus. We need to persevere in knowing and living the word. We need to persevere in the Spirit.
